Dismissal on Monday, November 20 is at 1:30. There is no student attendance Tuesday, November 21 thru Friday, November 24.

The Details:

Conferences on Monday, November 20 from 2:00-9:00 are IN-PERSON ONLY.

If you schedule a conference for Monday you do not need to schedule a conference for Tuesday. In-person conferences are 15 minutes with your child's Community Building Teacher and are scheduled through Skyward Family Access. Only one appointment is necessary because all grade level teachers will be located in the same space. Students should attend their conference and bring their Chromebook. Please be prompt. If you arrive late, the teacher may not be able to accommodate you.

Conferences on Tuesday, November 21 from 8:00 to noon are VIRTUAL ONLY.

Virtual conferences are 10 minutes and are scheduled through Skyward Family Access with the individual teacher(s) you would like to meet with. *It is not necessary to schedule a conference with every teacher*. Please be prompt. If you arrive late to your virtual conference, the teacher may not be able to accommodate you. Follow the process below to schedule with the teacher for a subject specific conference. Links to join your conference will be in Skyward when you book your appointment.

How to Schedule in-person or virtual conferences:

- 1. Log into Family Access using your username and password.
- 2. Click the **Conferences** link located on the left sidebar.
- 3. Once loaded, you will see all of your children's names. To begin the scheduling process, start with one of your students by selecting the **All Conferences** link next to their name.
- 4. Next, click on **Select a Time** next to your student's 1st period Community Building class to view available appointment times.
- 5. Click the **Select Link** next to the appointment you wish to make.
- 6. You must click the **Save** button on the confirmation screen.
- 7. Once you've saved your appointment, your conference will be scheduled and viewable by selecting the **View Scheduled Times** link.
- 8. Repeat the process for any additional Stanton students you have. If you would like to print out your conference time, click the link **Print All Scheduled Conferences**


Lakes Region Conference Co-Champions and Conference Tournament Champions



Dear 5th Grade Parents,

An instructor from Candor Health Education (formerly Robert Crown Center for Health Education) will be visiting Stanton School on Thursday, November 2nd. The topics that will be presented are physical development of males and females with an emphasis on changes that occur at puberty as well as a social and emotional components

Many of you may remember the "Linda" and "Michael" programs from previous years. Those programs have been updated and replaced with the "Puberty 1" program. Boys and girls will be separated for the program, but will learn the same content. The program is delivered using a storytelling approach to increase engagement and retention.

Fifth graders across the area have been learning about puberty from the Candor Center for over 20 years. The students, staff, and parents from surrounding school districts have been impressed with the appropriateness and thorough treatment of the subject in these professional presentations. The Candor Center for Health Education has visited Stanton School since 2016 and we had very positive feedback!

This presentation is free of charge to all Stanton School 5th graders! We are asking parents to please fill out the attached form ONLY if you would rather your child <u>NOT</u> attend the presentation by Monday, October 30th. Reminders from Nurse Lora

KEEPING OUR STUDENTS HEALTHY & SAFE


Students should be kept home for 24 hours after the last episode of FEVER (without fever reducing medication like Tylenol, Ibuprofen, Motrin, Advil) VOMITING OR DIARRHEA. If your child has had a fever at any point during the day, they should be kept home the following day even if they are fever free in the morning.


Please help us curtail illness outbreaks by assessing your child's wellness each morning. Due to the contagious nature of many illnesses during the winter months, please consider your child's physical complaints before leaving or sending them to school. If a child is suspect for illness at school they will be sent to the nurse for evaluation. If warranted, a parent/guardian will be contacted to arrange for the student to be picked up. Sick children cannot remain in the classroom and in many cases will not be allowed to ride transportation home. A child cannot successfully participate or focus in school when experiencing illness. **Please consider this before sending your child to school with symptoms.**

Currently circulating are respiratory illnesses that all present similarly, often WITHOUT A FEVER. A diagnosis <u>cannot</u> be made without a doctor's evaluation and appropriate testing for the following: Influenza, COVID, Pertussis (Whooping cough), RSV, Pneumonia, Common cold, Strep throat and seasonal allergies. A child with persistent cough or nasal drainage should be kept home until symptoms can be managed. Extreme fatigue and body aches are also an indication to consider keeping your child home.

The school may require a lab result or doctor office letter stating a return to school date if your child is exhibiting symptoms suspect for contagious reportable illness.

We appreciate your cooperation and partnership with this matter.


