

The interns join classroom teachers twice a week to observe and interact with our students to give them a better idea about the field of education. 


Sefcik added, "We are lucky to have five Grant Community High School students join us again this year on Thursdays and Fridays as part of their Introduction to Teaching class. The students spend a full period observing and interacting with our students and staff. We placed three students in 5th grade, one in 6th grade and for the first time we have a student shadowing with our mental health team. This program allows for students to explore the world of teaching prior to heading off to college and choosing a major field to study."



The students in Mrs. Brnot's Science classes rolled up their sleeves and participated in a chicken wing dissection lab. The students were looking at the similarities in structure and function between the chicken's wing and human's arms and legs. During the investigation, the classes were trying to figure out how the body heals after an injury, and how the skin, bones, and muscle systems are connected.





strong attendance has a proven impact on school success. Our education program is built on the premise that consistent attendance is vital to a student's success in the classroom. Chronic absence-missing 5 percent or more of school days for any reason—can translate in missed social interaction in addition to classroom instruction and discussion. The students in Mr. Yoder's 8th grade STEM classes were given the assignment to design a supportive, custom-sized ankle foot orthosis to help a patient with spastic hemiplegia. While working in teams, the students developed their strategy, learned how to use a list of requirements to guide their design process, and how to make adjustments when materials were unavailable or scarce. "The students were given 3 class periods to complete the assignment and overall, I was really impressed with how well they worked together to develop their prototypes. Their final results really showed off their critical thinking skills," said Mr. Yoder.

Hello Parents and Guardians,

This letter informs you of the Positive Behavioral Interventions and Support (PBIS) requirements for the 2023-2024 school year. PBIS is an evidence-based, tiered framework for supporting students' behavioral, academic, social, emotional, and mental health. Our PBIS core group is made up of Stanton School teachers and staff members. A representative leadership team that meets regularly and shares expertise in coaching, social, emotional, behavioral, academic, equity, mental health, physical health, wellness, and trauma.


When implemented with fidelity, PBIS improves social-emotional competence, academic success, and school climate. It is Stanton's PBIS representatives' goal to define positive school/program-wide expectations and prioritize appropriate social, emotional, and behavioral skills. Aligning classroom expectations with school/program-wide expectations PBIS implementation explicitly teaches expectations and skills to set all students up for success, encourages and acknowledges expected behavior, and prevents and responds to unwanted behavior in a respectful, instructional manner.

Our mission in implementing PBIS at Stanton School is to help our students feel safe and also create an environment where positive behaviors are expected.

PBIS celebrates a variety of events at Stanton School. In order for your child to participate in these PBIS events outside of school grounds, your child must have these criteria met. They must not receive any F's in their classes. Your child must not have more than 5 office discipline referrals or 3 detentions. Suspensions whether they are in school or out of school will count as one detention. Also, your child must maintain an average of 1.5 in any of their exploratory classes.

The PBIS team would like to thank you for your cooperation on this matter. We hope to make this 2023-2024 school year a positive experience for you as a parent as well as for your child. Please feel free to reach out with any questions.




